#### 2. Scope of this Notice

This Privacy Notice provides information on the processing of personal data when the publicly accessible website zsra.at is accessed. The separate “Data Protection Information for Engagements, Engagement Enquiries, Other Contacts and Applications” applies to engagements, engagement enquiries, other contacts and job applications.

#### 3. Accessing the Website and Server Log Data

When the website is accessed, the browser used transmits technically necessary connection data to the web server. The data processed may include, in particular, the IP address, the date and time of access, the resource accessed, the volume of data transferred, the status code, the referrer address and information about the browser and operating system.

The processing is carried out to make the website available, to ensure its secure and uninterrupted operation, to analyse errors and to prevent and investigate attacks or misuse. The legal basis is Article 6(1)(f) GDPR. The legitimate interests pursued are the purposes stated above.

The connection data are transmitted automatically and their transmission is technically necessary. Without these data, the website cannot be delivered to the user's terminal device.

Server log data are generally retained for no more than 30 days and are then deleted. They are retained beyond that period only to the extent required because of a security incident or a legal obligation, or for the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims.

#### 4. Recipients

Recipients of the website connection data are the hosting and IT service providers engaged by us and their sub-processors. Any further disclosure takes place only where required by law or necessary for the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims.

**5. Rights of Data Subjects**

Subject to the applicable statutory requirements, data subjects have the rights of access, rectification, erasure, restriction of processing and data portability. Data protection enquiries should be directed to the contact details set out in section 1.

**6. Right to Object**

Where processing is based on Article 6(1)(f) GDPR, data subjects may object on grounds relating to their particular situation. In that event, the relevant data will no longer be processed unless there are compelling legitimate grounds for the processing which override the interests, rights and freedoms of the data subject, or the processing is necessary for the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims.

**7. Right to Lodge a Complaint**
